

Brush up Hours

Those who wish to challenge a road test but have not had recent experience or wish to take a higher class road test such as the Class 5 Advanced road test will find brush up hours catering to their needs. Brush up hours are for a variety of individuals such as people who have received class 7 learner's license and completed the driver's ed program but want more instruction. Drivers who have recently moved to Alberta and are unfamiliar with the rules of the road here will also find brush up hours convenient and helpful when they are preparing for the road test. If you feel that you need more confidence through practice or even just want to work on specific techniques before your road test then the brush up course is perfect for you.

What is included?

Our driving instructors will provide a pick up and drop off for all students. Once inside the vehicle our instructors will guide the student through all the components of the vehicle and ensure that proper safety habits are acknowledged before they begin driving with the student. They will also discuss areas of driving where the student feels they are lacking and require the most assistance. After the lesson our instructors will provide an assessment for the student including tips and comments on the student's driving ability or where they require the most practice.

Recommendations and pre-requisites

In order to be eligible for brush-up hours the participant must have a minimum of a class 7 learner's license as required by law.

It is strongly recommended for students who have no prior experience in driving to first complete the Class 5 Basic Course. Completing the course will add a code to the driver's license that is recognized by Alberta insurance brokers and will result in lower insurance rates.

Out of Country Students

Drivers who have had driving experience outside of Canada but are uncertain about driving or road laws in Alberta will benefit from taking Alberta Driver Education and Training Brush Up courses. Canada has its own specific set of rules for driving and some of these rules vary province to province. There is also the added challenge of Canadian weather which can create some of the most dangerous road conditions on the planet and is well worth preparing for. In Alberta, drivers from out of country may drive with an international license. However, if you intend to drive for longer than 90 days or intend to stay in Alberta, you must exchange your license for an Alberta driver's license.

Taking a Class 5 Basic road test may be a necessary requirement in this process.
